As part of the first year Course 'Grundlagen der Geschichte und Theorie der Architektur I&II' 2023–2024, students were invited to explore the city of Zürich by looking at the variety of shop windows and vitrines that can be found across the city. The vitrine is a fascinating architectural and urban element that materialises and transgresses the border between public space and interior. Students were asked to analyse the architecture of vitrines in the form of diptychs – a combination of text and drawing – and these are presented in this exhibition. Together they construct a lexicon of vitrines that speaks of the characteristics of the city of Zurich.

How to House Europe? Within the Existing!**

Autumn Semester, 18:00 | ETH Zürich, Hönggerberg, HIL E1 or online

The existing building stock is our greatest opportunity: at this point only 25% of Europe's buildings have been renovated. To meet the European (and Swiss) Climate Goals for 2050, we need to triple the current annual renovation rate of 1%. Meanwhile, Switzerland is projected to see a population increase of 1 million people by 2050. This is a call for architects to act and address the challenge: how do we house these people? Within the existing structures!

This is a collective project by the Department of Architecture at ETH Zurich, aimed at finding architectural solutions to societal and planetary challenges. The lecture series will bring in perspectives from selected experts across various fields, providing a broader understanding of the topic. Each chair will address the theme through their unique methodology and architectural approach, focusing on both design and legislative aspects.
